

## A BRIEF INTRODUCTION OF BODOLAND UNIVERSITY

Bodoland University is the only University in entire BTAD area as well as of west Assam with a vision of cultivating high intellectual integrity and dissemination of knowledge. It is the outcome of long struggle and hopes and aspirations of the people of this region. The University aims at promoting and developing the socio-cultural and rural economy of the region by imparting value based education, doing research work and necessary training to the youths and thereby attempts at fulfilling their dreams of a secure and better future. Initially the Bodoland University was set up as a campus of Gauhati University in the name and style of 'Gauhati University, Kokrajhar Campus' in the year of 1997; which was upgraded into a full-fledged university in 2009 in the name and style of 'Bodoland University' by an Act of the Assam Legislative Assembly on 28 February 2009.

The University is located at Debargaon (26°28'8.98"N and 90°17'54.4"E) which is approximately 9 kms. from Kokrajhar town. The university campus is situated in a peaceful and calm environment which spreads over an area marked with scenic beauty and picturesque landscape. The campus has flourishing green paddy fields on the southern side, with the holy river Gaurang flowing on its western side. Again, the area has rural communities settled on the northern side of the University, and the serene Bodoland Martyrs' Cemetery to the east where one can enjoy a tranquil and leisurely time. The quiet ambience of the University provides a conducive atmosphere for the pursuance of intellectual excellence and uninterrupted research activities.





#### Connectivity:

Kokrajhar town functions as the head quarter of the Bodoland Territorial Council. Kokrajhar town offers all kinds of civic amenities and modern facilities to its inhabitants. Situated in Kokrajhar, the University is conveniently well connected by rail and road. Local transportations like bus, auto-rickshaw and taxi are easily available from Kokrajhar town; and the road leads towards and connects to the National Highway No. 31 at Karigaon. The nearest Railway station is the Kokrajhar Railway Station which serves as an important link to most of the major cities of India like Delhi, Kolkata, Mumbai, Chennai, Bangalore, Puri, Ahmadabad, Ranchi, Patna etc. The nearest Airports are Lokopriya Gopinath Bordoloi Airport at Borjhar, Guwahati and Baghdogra in West Bengal which are at the distance of about 200 KMs. From Kokrajhar. The University is also strategically located at a distance of 45 KMs. from West Bengal, 50 Kms. from Bhutan and 110 KMs. approximately from Bangladesh. The location makes it possible for students and researchers across the border to conveniently get access to the University. The University not only provides opportunities for higher studies to the populace of this region, it also caters to the educational needs of the adjoining states and neighboring countries like Bhutan, Nepal and Bangladesh. The University thus has the potential to foster liberal exchange of knowledge and ideas even beyond the territorial boundaries of the nation. Apart from the main campus of the University positioned at Debargaon, Kokrajhar, the University has two other plots of land at Haldibari and Subaijhar for further extension of the University.

Bodoland University presently has 16 academic departments under 6 schools of study. The department of Assamese, Bodo and English are under the faculty of Languages; the department of Economics, History, Political Science are under the faculty of Social Science; the department of Education under the faculty of School of Humanities; the department of Geography is under the faculty of School of Environmental Studies; the department of Mathematical Science, Biotechnology, Computer Science and Technology, Zoology, Botany, Physics and Chemistry are under the faculty of Sciences and department of Studies on Management is under the faculty of Management Studies. Apart from the academic departments mentioned, there are five centers of study, viz. Centre for Bodo studies, Centre for Women studies, Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies, Antiquarian Study Centre and Research Centre on Mushroom and Bamboo Technology. Further, the University offers Diploma in Bamboo Technology and Application (Department of Biotechnology) and Diploma in Human Rights conducted by Department of Political Science. The PG institutional Bio-Tech Hub is associated with Department of Biotechnology which is well-equipped with instrumentation facilities and basic laboratory resources for adhering to the needs of the M.Sc. and Ph.D. students. Again recently the DBT, Govt. of India has approved the project of establishing Bio-informatics Infrastructure facilities (BIF) in this Department.

The University has faculty members who are dedicated, well-equipped and noted academicians from various parts of the country. Over the years, the University has been able to welcome an increasing number of students not only from the BTAD area and several parts of North-East India, but also from other parts of the nation.

Bodoland University is open and flexible to modern innovations in higher education. In response to transforming outlook in the field of academics and learning, the University is adopting the Choice Based Credit System (CBSC) curriculum introduced and initiated by UGC with effect from academic session 2015-16.

Keeping in view the need to excel in scholastic and research oriented activities, the University from time to time organizes and conducts a number of national and international seminars, conferences and workshops etc. and thus provides an intellectual platform to discuss, debate and enunciate knowledge on various disciplines by renowned academicians, educationists along with research scholars and students.

The aim of the University is to strive for all round progress and development by imparting quality education to the students of the ethnically and culturally diverse communities of this region. The main objective of the University is to work for the advancement in knowledge and impart instructional and research facilities to its students in fully need-based and unexplored areas so that, their latent talents and potentials could be realized to the optimum level. The University as a centre of higher learning is committed to work for the integration of the society through active participation of the common masses, teaching, learning and organizing various training programmes for the welfare and development of the rural people in various fields.

## CENTERS

Apart from the above mentioned 16 (Sixteen) Departments, there are three Centers, and Research units in the university, viz:

- (a) Centre for Bodo Studies
- (b) Centre for Women Studies
- (c) Antiquarian Study Centre
- (d) Research Centre Unit of Mushroom and Bamboo Technology
- (e) Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies.

#### 1. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

#### I. Eligibility for M.A./M.Sc.:

- a. B.A./B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Major/Honours Course in the concerned subject,
- b. B.A. /B.Sc. (in the 10 + 2 + 3 pattern) with General/ Pass Course with 50% marks or equivalent grade.

#### II. Eligibility for M.Sc. in Computer Science & Information Technology:

- a. B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Major/Honours Course in the concerned subject.
- b. B.C.A./B.Sc. (IT) (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Mathematical Science in 10+2 level.
- c. B.Sc. (in the 10 + 2 + 3 pattern) with Computer Science/Information Technology as a pass course/elective subject.
- d. B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with General/Pass Course with one year Computer Diploma (Post-Graduate) from recognised institute and Mathematical Sciences in 10+2 level.
- e. B.E./B. Tech. (CSE or IT)

#### III. Eligibility for M.Sc. in Biotechnology:

- a. Science Graduate having honours in any of the Biological Sciences.
- b. Pass Course students with minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade for General and OBC, 45% or equivalent grade for ST and SC. Having at least one biological Subject in their course combination during graduation is mandatory.

#### IV. Eligibility for DBT (Diploma in Bamboo Technology):

H.S passed. (Any Stream)

#### V. Eligibility for M.B.A.:

A Bachelor's Degree of 10+2+3 pattern with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in aggregate or in Major/Honours subject (if any) from any recognized University.

Eligible applicants will have to appear in a written test, intended to evaluate their quantitative aptitude, general awareness and proficiency in English, to be conducted by Bodoland University as common entrance tests for the MBA programme.

However candidates who have appeared in any one of the All India Common Entrance Tests for admission to an MBA programme, viz. CAT, XAT, MAT or ATMA, and scored marks not less than 75 percentile, are exempted from appearing in the written test conducted by the University.

Candidate qualifying in the written test conducted by Bodoland University or a candidate having scored marks not less than 75 percentile in the aforesaid All India Common Entrance Tests shall be permitted to appear in the Group Discussion and Interview for final selection.



#### VI. Eligibility for M.C.A.:

Bachelor's degree in any discipline with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in major/honours subject or 55% marks or equivalent grade in aggregate for those candidates having no major/honours. Passed in Mathematics at 10+2 level.

#### VII. Eligibility for PGDHRE:

Any graduate with 45% marks or equivalent grade, having interest to study Human Rights.

#### VIII. Eligibility for Ph.D.:

Admission to the Ph.D. Programme shall be done preferably in the beginning of the academic year. Any person with at least 55% marks or equivalent Grade (50% marks or equivalent Grade in case of SC/ST candidates) in a Master's Degree of this University and from other University recognized by the UGC in any subject like Faculties of Humanities, Arts, Science, Commerce, Law, Management, Technology, Fine Arts, Engineering Science and Medical

All candidates shall have to appear in the admission test to be conducted by the concerned department.

(Admission for Ph.D. Programmes will be initiated separately by notification)

#### 2. RESERVATION OUOTA:

- a. 80% of Seats will be reserved for the students from the colleges of B.T.A.D. areas.
- b. Reservation of seats for the students belonging to SC, ST (P), ST (H), OBC and MOBC categories will be as per Govt. rules. These seats will be allotted to candidates on the basis of original certificates issued by the competent authority. A few seats are also reserved for differently abled students.

#### b. Admission on the basis of Sports/Extra-curricular Activities:

For admission against the quota allotted for extra-curricular activities like Cultural, Sports, NCC, Scouts and Guides, the candidates will have to face a personal interview/fitness test.



Sportsmen representing the country at International meets will be admitted directly.

#### c. Reservation under Extra-Curricular & Co-Curricular Activities:

A few seats may be offered for admission to M.A./M.Sc./M.B.A./M.C.A Courses to students within intake capacity who have shown extraordinary proficiency in Extra-curricular activities in the last three years preceding graduation. Events of Sports and other extra-curricular activity will be those incorporated in the Inter-University Sports/Cultural/Literary Competitive meets. Any sport/event organised by an association must be recognised by and affiliated to the national body for that sport/event and by Indian Olympic Association. Preference will be given to candidates in the following order:

- a. Those who have represented the country in the International events.
- b. Those who have represented their states in the National/International events.
- c. Those who have represented their institutions in International/National events.
- d. Those who have won Prizes at recognised International/National level events.
- e. Those who have won Prizes at recognised State level competitions.
- f. Those who have represented the University in N.S.S. Camp at National level.
- g. Those who have obtained NCC 'C' Certificates or participated in the Republic Day Parade under NCC

#### 3. RELAXATION OF MARKS:

Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST/OBC/MOBC) shall be given relaxation up to 5% (five percent) of the marks prescribed for admission. The relaxation will not be applicable to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

#### 4. COURSEDURATION:

The Course of studies leading to the award of degree of Masters shall be based on the course duration of the respective departments and area of study:

- a. M.A./M.Sc./MBA 2 years (4 Semesters)
- b. MCA-3 years (6 Semesters)
- c. DBT-1 year (2 Semesters)
- d. PGDHRE 1 year (2 Semester)

#### 5. PROCEDURE TO APPLY:

- a. The candidate is required to go through the prospectus carefully and acquaint himself/ herself with all requirements with regard to filling in of the online application form.
- b. A candidate is allowed to submit separate applications for separate departments.
- c. The application can be either downloaded or purchased.



- d. Self attested copies of the certificates/documents should be submitted at the time of application submission:
  - I. Degree Mark-sheets (All the semesters and consolidated, if available)
  - ii. H. S. L. C. Certificate or Admit Card for verification of age. Relevant certificate(s) from concerned authority in case of applying for admission under any category of reservation. iii.H.S.S.L.C. Certificates.

#### 6. ENTRANCE:

- a. Entrance Tests for all the PG courses will be conducted in all the subjects.
- b. An entrance fee of Rs. 200/- will be charged along with Prospectus fees.
- c. The entrance test for admission in PG and Ph.D. programme shall be conducted by the concerned department and dates will be notified in the university website. In-service Ph. D. candidates will have to submit "No Objection Certificate" from the head of the institution where he/she is working along with the filled in form. The DRC shall decide about the number of Ph.D. Scholars to be guided by a supervisor in accordance with Bodoland University revised Ph.D. Regulations, 2014 and with present UGC regulations.
- d. M.Phil admission will be done by the departments offering M.Phil Course by conducting entrance test.

#### 7. PROCEDURE FOR SELECTION:

Based on merit of the Entrance Examination.

#### 8. DECLARATION OF RESULTS:

After completion of Entrance test, the concerned departments will declare their results on as fixed dates mention in page no. 2. The names of candidates who qualify for admission will be displayed on the departmental and Administrative Office notice board. The result will also be available on university website www.bodolanaduniversity.ac.in. The University will not be responsible for delay in receipt/non-receipt of intimation by the candidates.

The University will not intimate the individual unsuccessful candidates regarding the result of Entrance Test. No correspondence in this regard will be entertained.

#### 9. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

- a. The admission into PG course will be based on entrance examination. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final and binding.
- b. If a forged document submitted by a candidate is detected even after admission, the admission will stand cancelled.

- c. The Admission Committee has every right to refuse admission, if the candidate fails to produce the original documents at the time of admission.
- d. A candidate must face the counselling personally at the time of admission. However, if the candidate cannot turn up due to unavoidable reasons his/ her guardian may represent him/ her.
- e. Fees once paid are not refundable.

#### f. Date of Admission:

- I. Subject-wise Admission will be done on notified dates.
- ii. Admission of Waiting List Candidates will be held on the same date in the respective subject after completion of the admission of selected candidates.

#### g. Commencement of Classes:

Post Graduate classes will start from the First Week of August, 2016 respectively.

Applicants are advised to find out the exact dates from the concerned Departments.

#### h. Cancellation of Seats:

A student failing to attend classes for 07 days (Seven days) at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his/her seat. Admission fees is non refundable.

#### 10. DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED:

## Documents to be attached at the time of Admission along with the Application Form (Attested copies):

- a. Number of Photographs 2 recent passport size copies.
- b. Degree Mark-sheets (All the semesters and consolidated, if available)
- c. Certificates from the Head of the Institution last attended.
- d. H. S. L. C. Certificate or Admit Card for verification of age/Relevant certificate(s) from concerned authority in case of applying for admission under any category of reservation.
- e. H.S.S.L.C. Certificates.
- f. Migration Certificate.
- g. Students passing the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from any of the followings, whichever is applicable:
  - a) The Head of the Institution last attended.
  - b) Officer in-charge of the nearest Police Station.
  - c) Govt. Gazetted Officer testifying his/her activities during the interim period.
  - d) Medical Certificate from the Govt. Medical Officer on genuine medical grounds.



#### 11. ATTENDANCE:

75% class attendance is compulsory to appear in all end semester examinations.

#### 12. SUPREME COURT RULES REGARDING ANTI RAGGING:

- a. As per direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus and all the Bodoland University authorities are determined not to allow any form of ragging. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging within or outside the University shall have an FIR lodged against him/her and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending the classes, withholding / withdrawing fellowship / scholarship and other financial benefits or withholding the result.
- b. The candidates as well as their parents, at the time of admission of the students to the Institute, will be required to furnish an undertaking in the form of an affidavit that the candidates will not indulge in any form of ragging.

#### c. Submission of Affidavits on Ragging:

All admitted students will have to submit two duly-filled Affidavits on Ragging to the concerned Head of Department within 15 days of their admission to the course. The formats for these Affidavits are given (as Appendix I for the student and as Appendix II for the parent/guardian) as per UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. Students admitted to B.U. hostels will have to submit a second set of the two Affidavits to the Warden of the concerned hostel within 15 days of their hostel admission.

#### 13. HOSTELACCOMMODATION:

There are two hostels for boys and three hostels for girls in the University campus. The total number of seats will be allotted to the departments equally as per enrolment. Selection will be strictly on merit basis. The process of selection for accommodation will begin with admission.

#### 14. CANTEEN:

There is a well equipped canteen for all the members of the university where one can have well cooked and hygienic food; and another canteen is under construction in the university campus.

### 15. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S)

There are two units of N.S.S consisting of one hundred students volunteers per each unit. There is a proposal for expanding it to five units from the current session. A Pre-Republic Parade Day National Camp (Eastern Zone) was successfully conducted and held from 7th Nov, to 16th Nov, 2015 in the University campus.

#### DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY

The department was established in the year 2008-09 with 06 nos, of students. The present intake capacity of each semester is 20. The Department offers four elective papers in the 4th semester viz. Computational Biology, Stem Cell Biology, Industrial Food Biotechnology and Environmental Biotechnology. The Department has started to offer Ph. D. program from the academic session of 2013-14. The Department is well-equipped with instrumentation facility and basic laboratory amenities for catering to the need of the M.Sc. and Ph.D. students. The Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Government of India has selected this department to establish an Institute level Biotech Hub for infrastructure and manpower development. Recently, the DBT, Government of India has approved the project to establish Bioinformatics Infrastructure Facility (BIF) in this Department. The department is deeply associated with teaching, research and extension running parallel as an integral part of regular curricula both for the upliftment of R & D programme in the region and also for fringe village improvisation. As a mandate, the department takes active care in regular career counselling for students through advance career oriented training which enable them to secure placement to establish them. The department has a mission to impart skill based scientific and technical knowledge to students, with a vision to produce trained biotechnologists. Focused research and development activities in the department have empowered the Biotechnological knowledge with vast applications in human health, agriculture, environment and industrial sectors.

The Department of Biotechnology has taken initiatives for "Earn While you learn programme" for students to earn with mushroom cultivation and vermicompost production. The Department has a self sustaining Mushroom Unit for conducting extension programme, counseling, training on mushroom cultivation and value added product to fringe areas of Kokrajhar, Barpeta, Baksa and Udalguri. The mushroom unit distributes Mushroom spawns (plug spawn, grain spawn and liquid spawn) to rural entrepreneurs. The Unit has been offering training to Indian Army Jawans, rural entrepreneurs and NGOs. The mushroom unit with the help of DBT, Govt. of India sponsored IBT-Hub conducted more than 50 awareness, training and entrepreneurship development programmes. The Unit produces seed (spawn) for 11 species of Pleurotus (Oyster), 2 species of Agaricus (Button), 1 species of Lentinula (Shitake) and four strains of Paddy straw mushroom (Volvariella volvaceae). The Unit has helped 18 entrepreneurs to establish their business.

#### **BAMBOO TECHNOLOGY UNDER DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY**

Diploma in Bamboo Technology course initiated in 2013-14 as an 'Add on' course under the aegis of Department of Biotechnology, Bodoland University is sponsored by the Agriculture Department, Bodoland Territorial Council Secretariat, Bodofa Nwgwr, Kokrajhar and National Mission on Bamboo Application, New Delhi. The primary aim of the course is to motivate students for self employment, as well as to carry out extensive research in various aspects of bamboo with particular emphasis in bamboo cultivation and germplasm conservation.

Bamboo is an important natural, renewable livelihood resource in Bodoland Territorial Council which grows in about one third of natural forest as pure and mixed are cultivated on homestead & Non-forest land. Bamboo production in Bodoland Territorial Council area is quite low and there is a need to enhance it through scientific cultivation of suitable species and improved management of bamboo based Non-forest or forest.

Since, bamboo is the main source of livelihood for rural people of this region. It is therefore the need of the hour to make the people aware of the proper use and scope of Bamboo in Bodoland.

The course is very much important for Bodoland Territorial Council because it provides them in-depth knowledge in various aspects of bamboos and also unique opportunity for a career in one of the green gold industrial processing sectors viz. bamboo based industry, responsible for processing bamboo and other renewable fibre materials to meet certain vital human needs in most environment friendly manner. It facilitates evolving strategies for augmenting production, application of relevant technologies & adaptation to global market.

Eligibility Criteria and Procedure for Admission

Education qualification: H.S. passed in any discipline from recognized College is eligible to apply. Desirable degree in Science/Engineering from a recognized University.

Selection procedure: Candidates are selected from all over the country on the basis of the marks obtained at the qualifying examinations by preparation of state-wise merit list. Preference in admission is given to candidates sponsored by industries or organization.

Age limit: Upper age limit is 28 years as on 1st January of the course year. Relaxation in 5 (five) years for ST/SC/PH is as per the Government of India rules.

#### Bamboo propagation Centre cum Bambusetum:

A Bamboo Propagation Centre cum Bambusetum has been constructed in the University campus in 2014 -2015. The propagation centre consists of six propagation beds for conducting practical on local commercial bamboo propagation using various techniques like branch cuttings, culm cuttings, rhizome etc.
