Assessment

Assessment of the students' attainment will be two-fold, consisting of Internal Assessment Examination (IAE) and End Semester Examination (ESE). The ratio between IAE and ESE will normally be 40:60

All ESEs except practical and Extension-Work will be evaluated by two examiners, namely the Subject Teacher and an External Examiner to be selected from among a panel to be provided by the Director/HoD of respective school.

End Semester Examination (ESE):

ESE will consist of a written examination of three hours' duration for a maximum score of 60. The question papers of the ESE will be divided into three units, corresponding to the units of the syllabus of the Course, and each question will have three sets of choices (A,B&C), consisting of very short , short and long questions respectively.

The passing minimum in ESE will be 30% in individual paper and 40% in aggregate, except for the School of Architecture and School of Law as they are governed by the Council of Architecture and Bar Council of India respectively. Grading will be done only for students who obtain the passing minimum marks.

A student who disqualify in ESE on account of any reasons like Failing/ill-health/unexpected calamity may take it as Re-appear Exam alongwith next semester Examination.

Attendance:

Normally a student must attain a minimum of 75% attendance to become eligible to take the ESE in a Course. However, condonation of shortage of attendance will be granted on genuine medical grounds upto a maximum of 10% of the contact days. For this purpose, the student must, immediately upon returning to class after the period of illness, apply for the

condonation, submitting a valid medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner through his/her HOD to the Director, who will decide upon the application for condonation of shortage of attendance. Medical certificates submitted on the eve of the ESE will not be accepted.

If a student has earned less than 75% attendance, he/she will be debarred from the ESE in the Course and his/her Statement of Grades will read (Inadequate Attendance) against that Course..

Condonation of attendance upto a maximum of 10% shall be given by the Director/HoD of the concerned School offering the Course on genuine reasons like ill health etc. For this the students have to provide documentary evidence like medical certificate from a qualified medical practitioner immediately after returning to the campus after availing the leave.

16. Strength and Weaknesses of the University

16.1	Strengths of the University	

Noida International University is the Largest private university in the Delhi NCR with 73 acres of land in the green belt of Yamuna Expressway, facing India's first ever car race track known as Formula One. The NIU has been established by the UP State Legislature Act 27 of 2010 and recognized by the University Grants Commission. Situated in the serene rural backdrop of Dankaur village, away from hustle-bustle of the Metro chaos of air, water and noise pollution, the NIU has high vision and mission for the rural youths to provide them technical education which would equip them for better employment in India and abroad.

The academic ambiance is so encouraging that students, both male and female, from far away countries like Congo, Nigeria, Afghanistan, Bhutan, Bangladesh prefer to join the NIU not only to

study the desired courses and programmes but also to study the Oriental literature, ethics, morals and human values which this world needed the most today, particularly the youth of the world.

Committed to the social cause, it teaches some subjects to the local, national and international students which most of the private university fear to introduce. Education in Human Values, Behavioural Sciences, PEP and alike are some of the features to showcase the mission of the NIU to guide and monitor the university students to become good citizens first and technocrats later. Regular classes of these subjects have paid dividends too as no incidents of ragging, rowdism, female harassment etc. ever took place during the last two years.

Free bus service to teachers and employees and nominal bus fare from students from all parts of the Delhi NCR to the NIU and back is one of the major tributes to the cause of higher education. Various efforts of the NIU like special classes for the needy, remedial classes for English writing and speaking, Ph.D. classes for the working teachers and executives even on week-end days are helping the rural students to excel their genius in times to come. Cut-throat competition in education sector is a great threat to the new emerging universities like the NIU. To compete with decades old institutions, the NIU initially had some teething trouble, but it rose to face the challenge before finding out that not one, but half a dozen universities are going to start in the vicinity of NIU opposite the Formula 1. Self financing institutions have their own problems in initial stages and besides finance, attracting academicians and education-administrators of eminence for a new university has been a weakness for the NIU as of all institutions. The distant positioning of the university has also been considered as a weak point for this university but its academics and commitment for the cause by the university promoters and stakeholders is overpowering these weaknesses slowly and gradually.
